Session Overviews

D2L Update

Latest news and announcements concerning the Desire2Learn (D2L) learning management system. Topics will include: notable features in the current version, coming features in the next release, report on the D2L Student Orientation, status of third-party integrations, adding and removing students from the classlist, tracking student activity, setting course start and end dates, using news items effectively, allowing students to see their current grade, and more as time allows.

Hands Only CPR

One quarter of Americans say they've been in a situation where someone needed CPR. If you were one of them, would you know what to do? Hands-only CPR is a potentially lifesaving technique involving no mouth to mouth contact. It is best used in emergencies where someone has seen another person collapse. The hands-only technique increases the likelihood of surviving cardiac emergencies that occur outside medical settings.
